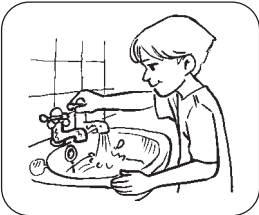
WHAT TO DO

- Use your results and your knowledge of litres to suggest how many litres are needed for each of the activities opposite.
- Talk about your answers with an adult. Is there any way you can check how much water these things use?



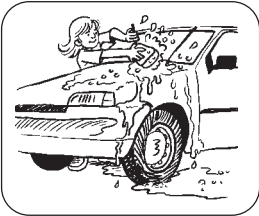
